

WHAT IS A NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN?

A Neighbourhood Plan is led by the Parish Council. The Plan enables the village to influence the nature of the inevitable changes that will take place over the next 20 years. It will ensure that local people have a say about new development proposed in the parish, whether it is new houses, new buildings for local businesses, or changes to the local road network.

An application has been made to Sedgemoor to designate the whole Parish to be covered by the Neighbourhood Plan (as the "Neighbourhood Area"). The map below shows the extent of the Area, outlined in dark blue.



The answers to this questionnaire, and the opinions voiced in consultations, will form the substance of the Neighbourhood Plan, which will have legal weight – planners will have to take it into account when considering planning applications. For example, the Plan can:

- say where new houses should go and what they should look like
- say what infrastructure should be paid for by new development, such as footpaths, play areas, community and health facilities, improvements to roads and junctions
- safeguard green spaces (the playing field, the Millennium Wood, the allotments)
- · give protection to existing community facilities
- support local businesses, for example by allocating suitable premises

Under the leadership of the Parish Council, a working group has been formed which includes Parish Councillors and members of the community, assisted by a professional planning consultant. Over the next two years, they and the whole community will all be working together to collect information and opinions and draw up a plan.


