
MacMillan Coffee Morning 2025

Sir Ashley Fox, MP for Bridgwater and Burnham, visited Nether Stowey on Friday, 17 October. He was welcomed at the Thomas Poole library by Sian Stafford and Nigel Phillips. Sir Ashley was impressed by the facilities at the library and by all that the library has to offer for the local community. Sir Ashley's visit was prompted by his wish to learn more about the activities of Stowey Green Spaces Group, several of whose members were present (sporting their Stowey Green Spaces high-viz jackets)!



Roy Osborne thanked the library for hosting the visit before summarizing for Sir Ashley the areas in and around the Stoweys in which SGSG works. Paul Brierley explained that the group's volunteers pick litter in both villages and their surrounds on the third Saturday of every month. It was fitting that the meeting should take place at the library, which it is hoped will become an information hub for local environmental groups and activities.

Sir Ashley expressed interest in seeing for himself some of the work carried out by SGSG volunteers. After leaving the library he visited Stowey Millennium wood, where it was explained that both the Millennium Wood (and extensions) and Stowey Wood itself form part of a nature friendly farming corridor which extends from Stowey Rocks organic farm through New Stowey farm (now under the management of the Quantock Hills National Landscape) almost to Over Stowey and the fringes of the Quantock Hills.



Autumn apple cake with Somerset brandy syrup

As a chef, autumn is my favourite time of year with the arrival of the game season, rich red wine sauces and roaring fires.

Here is a dish to use up some of the windfall apples that are everywhere at the moment. It is a cake but very light as it's made with ground almonds.

Serve with ice cream or dare I say apple brandy flavoured custard. I used "Grenadier" apples for this cake but any cooking apples will do.

Ingredients

300g ground almonds

50g plain flour

200g castor sugar

200g salted butter

5 beaten eggs

8g baking powder

Juice of 1 lemon

2 large cooking apples

For the syrup

80ml Somerset Apple Brandy

200ml apple juice
30g castor sugar
Juice of half a lemon

Method

Peel and core the apples. Slice and cut into cubes. Place in a small saucepan with 20g of butter and gently cook down for about 5mins. Add the lemon juice. Cook for another 2-3 minutes and take off the heat to cool.

Using a stand mixer beat sugar and butter together until fluffy. Add flour and eggs and gently mix to create a batter. Add the baking powder.

Now add the cooled apples into the batter and gently mix through. Now pour the mixture into a 28cm lined and buttered quiche tin and place in a pre heated oven at 180 degrees C for 30-35 mins.

Apple brandy syrup

Into a small saucepan put in the apple juice and sugar and gently heat until the sugar is dissolved. Now add the apple brandy and lemon juice. Let the syrup bubble gently until a nice syrupy consistency is achieved. Take off the heat.

When the cake is cooked, ie when a skewer is pushed in and comes out clean, pierce the cake all over and pour the apple brandy syrup all over the cake. Leave to cool . Serve with ice cream or custard.

Natural Thoughts

Fungi and that autumn feeling!

Its that time of the year when summer is definitely being edged out by autumn but there are so many reasons to welcome autumn and to keep on enjoying our wonderful countryside around the Stowy's.

The last few weeks have seen large numbers of fungi suddenly appearing above ground, with one of the very commonest being the Honey Fungus *Armillaria mellea*. This is a typical mushroom looking fungi that is a pale fawn/honey colour. I have seen lots of large patches of this fungi on grassy banks, roadside verges and also in my own garden. Also very noticeable have been Parasols *Macrolepiota procera*. They look a little like umbrellas or parasols and occur as single fungi but often with several growing quite close to each other. The Castle mound in Stowey is a great place to spot them on the grassland there. The third fungi seen growing commonly in recent weeks, has been the stunning Fly Agaric *Amanita muscaria*. This is the one with a bright red cap covered with white dots. This is also the fungi featured in many children's books with fairies or pixies dancing around it. Fly Agarics have been seen in their hundreds on the on heathland and woodland edges in the Dead Woman's Ditch and Crowcombe Park Gate area. Despite being highly poisonous to humans they are eaten with great enthusiasm by slugs with no ill effects!

These are just three of the hundreds of fungi found around the Stowys and on the Quantocks, and the best time to look for fungi is from late summer through to December. Fungi don't like very cold frosty weather or snow. Having said that, It's only the above, fruiting, part of the fungi that can't cope with the cold, their underground part, the mycelium, will be happily growing underground throughout winter.

Having burst out of the ground, many of the typical capped fungi may only last for a few days or even a few hours, rotting quickly away having spread their spores. But huge numbers disappear rapidly as they are eaten by voracious slugs!



Over and Out

Nick's Gardening Notes



November 2025

In the next four months we are likely to experience mixed weather which we need to prepare the garden for.

Rain: avoid walking on/working the soil when it is too wet to reduce the chance of compacting the soil.

Wind: check that stakes/plant supports are doing their job and if necessary, cane taller vegetables such as Brussels sprouts.

Frost: protect tender plants with fleece and mulch tender perennials left in the ground such as Dahlias, Salvias, etc.

Plants for free: it is an excellent month for taking hardwood cuttings of black and redcurrants, gooseberries and shrubs such as coloured stem dogwoods, willow, forsythia, flowering currants, roses and buddleia. The cutting is normally 200mm to 300mm long and taken from strong healthy growth produced in 2025 and must be sufficiently substantial to

survive the winter outside, aim for pencil thickness. Make a sloping cut just above a bud and a straight basal cut below a bud. Treat with hormone rooting powder (optional) and making a slit with a spade insert the cuttings into the soil to two thirds their length. If your soil is prone to poor drainage place some grit beneath the cutting. Alternatively, the correct conditions can be produced in a deep container using peat free/multi-purpose potting compost and placed outside in a sheltered position and ensuring that they do not dry out. Roots will be produced during the 2026 growing season.

Ornamentals: Autumn and winter winds can disturb the base of taller bush roses and reducing them in height prior to their main pruning in late February will help prevent wind rock. Herbaceous perennials and some grasses can be tidied up but remember good quality flower-heads and seed pods can look very attractive throughout the winter especially on frosty mornings.

Leaves should be raked up and turned into valuable leaf mould. This can be done by stacking them in a wire netting enclosure and occasionally turning them or putting them in black bin bags with some moisture and once tied pierce the bag with a fork. Running the rotary mower over them first creates greater surface area and speeds up decomposition.

Bulb planting: this is a good time to get tulips and hyacinths planted either in the soil or in containers. I like to use perforated pond containers which can then be plunged into the soil and lifted out after flowering avoiding putting the prong of a fork through a bulb.

Five plants for seasonal interest: bark -Acer griseum and Betula utilis var. jacquemontii, scent - Elaeagnus x ebbingei 'Gilt Edge', berries – Pyracantha 'Watereri' and a grass with winter flower heads - Miscanthus sinensis.

The greenhouse: this can be cleared, cleaned thoroughly, and prepared for winter. Why not try some winter lettuce/salad leaves? Winter Gem is an excellent small cos variety and can be planted either in the soil or in gro-bags. Three or four well rooted strawberry runners can also be planted in a gro-bag or container and these will produce early strawberries in 2026.

The vegetable plot: press on with the winter digging provided the ground conditions are not too wet. This allows as much time as possible for frosts to help break down the clods of soil in advance of sowing/planting next year. No dig beds should be cleared and a dressing of compost applied. Ensure that any perennial weeds are thoroughly removed. The earliest broad beans and peas can still be obtained from a November sowing using the correct varieties, i.e. Aquadulce Claudia for the beans and Onward or Feltham First for peas. Soil should be prepared as normal but avoid adding any fertiliser as a compact, hard (tough) plant will withstand the winter weather better. It is still not too late for garlic to be planted.



An evening celebrating the great folk-music collector, Cecil Sharp, who began his pioneering work on English folk music in Somerset, collecting many pieces from the Quantock area.



MEH on the move

By the end of this year, civil construction for Unit 1 will be 95% complete. Unit 2 is following closely behind and is expected to reach the same milestone by the end of next year.

With the main structural work nearly finished, we're now moving into the next phase: installing mechanical, electrical, and heating systems. We're also making great progress on room handovers. By year-end, 2,500 rooms will be handed over, bringing us closer to our goal of delivering 7,000 rooms across the entire project.

Big Boost for Victoria Park Community Centre

Victoria Park Community Centre in Bridgwater has been awarded nearly £47,000 from the Hinkley Point C Community Fund to enhance its facilities and support key services like the youth club and Local Pantry. The grant will fund new equipment, staff costs, and help provide affordable food to families—benefiting over 1,000 weekly visitors and strengthening community connections across all ages.



Powering Ahead: First Electrical Cabinets Installed on Nuclear Island

We've reached another exciting milestone — our first electric switchgear cabinets are now installed on Nuclear Island, and ahead of schedule. These cabinets will play a vital role in powering the safety and operational systems in the Safeguard Buildings.

Their installation marks a shift in focus from construction work to the next phase: installing mechanical, electrical, and ventilation systems (MEH). The first units are now in place in one of the Safeguard Buildings, setting the stage for the complex network of control systems and cabling needed to support future testing and commissioning.

Dear Everyone,

Gathering to remember – whether in joy, in sadness, or in reflection – continues to be important. It builds and strengthens our community, and ensures that what, or who, we are remembering isn't ever forgotten.

May God bless you in your remembering this November.

On 9th October, we had a return visit from Ursula Franklin, who delivered a very informative talk and presentation on the island of Madagascar.

Madagascar came into being about 88 million years ago, when it separated from the mainland's of Africa and Asia after the break-up of the supercontinent Gondwana, leaving it stranded, separated 250 miles from Africa by the Mozambique Channel. It is the 4th largest island in the world, measuring 1000 miles long and 250 miles wide at its widest point and covering an area of 226,656 sq. miles.

It has 4 climate/geological zones, causing extremes of weather conditions, ranging from the dry plains in the west, through the low and central plateaux to the lush remnants of an ancient rain forest in the east coast, home to the few remaining huge, water-storing Baobab trees, and then sloping down to the Indian Ocean.

We are all aware that meerkats are indigenous to Madagascar, but there are actually 100 species and sub-species of this animal, not just the 'cute' ones that appear on our TV screens.

Because of its isolation, Madagascar has outstanding biodiversity. Many of its animals, birds, insects and plants are found nowhere else on earth; 90% of its plants, 95% of its reptiles and 85% of its animals are endemic to the island. Madagascar holds many records for having the smallest, largest, or strangest of

many of its species, and has the world's 5th largest coral reef at approximately 280 miles. It can also boast the smallest known chameleon, unbelievably only 2.2 cm from nose to tail, and the largest - a whopping 68.5 cm (or 27 inches). Whilst 5% of all the world's known animal and plant species exist in Madagascar, they also have the 2nd highest number of endangered mammals in the world, a testament to habitat changes.

Unfortunately, over the last few decades the island has been invaded by the Ghost Crab, probably arriving on a boat, but as they are poisonous and have no predators, have been spreading relentlessly across the island in their thousands.

Our next meeting on 13th November will be about Laser Printing. Visitors will be very welcome. Meetings are held on the 2nd Thursday of the month, from 2.00 - 4.00 pm in the Church Centre. Admission includes refreshments and a raffle.

There will be no general open meeting on 11th December, as the Members' will be having their Christmas lunch.

At our first meeting of 2026, on 8th January, we will be learning about Mary's Meals a charity set up in Scotland in 2002 to feed and educate children in some of the world's poorest communities, followed on 12th February 2026 with a return visit from Brian Wright, who this time will be telling us about the origins of Nursery Rhymes.
